Hungarians in the United States

Special Feature: Delray, Michigan

For Hungarians, the main area of settlement in Michigan was an area of Detroit know as Delray. Delray was an independent village until it was annexed by Detroit in 1906 and is located in the southwest area of Detroit on the banks of the Detroit River and Rouge River. Beginning in the late 1880s, Hungarians began arriving in Delray because of the job opportunities offered by various factories such as Solvay Processing, Michigan Malleable Iron Company as well as many others.

Soon Hungarians began building places of worship such as Holy Cross Hungarian Roman Catholic Church (which is still in Delray and has an active congregation), First Hungarian Reformed Church, St John the Baptist Hungarian Byzantine Catholic Church, the First Hungarian Lutheran Church, First Hungarian Baptist Church, the Synagogue of the Hebrew Congregation of Delray and the Hungarian Pentecostal Church. Delray also had many Hungarian businesses such as shops, markets, theaters, bars and restaurants.

By the 1920 census, there were 22,293 Hungarian-Americans in Detroit, with most of them living in the Delray area. (13,564 foreign born and 8,729 of their children). Detroit was the 4th largest Hungarian settlement in the US after New York, Cleveland and Chicago.

The state of Michigan has had six waves of emigration from Hungary between 1880 and the early 2000s. According to the 2018 American Community Survey, Michigan has 89,785 Americans claiming Hungarian descent.

Over the years, Hungarians and their children began spreading out to the suburbs of Detroit such as River Rouge, Ecorse, Melvindale, Taylor, Lincoln Park, Allen Park, Dearborn, Southgate, Wyandotte, Trenton and many other communities in Metro Detroit. The Hungarian community of Metro Detroit is still very active: Hungarian-American Cultural Center (Taylor), Holy Cross Hungarian Roman Catholic Church (Delray/Detroit), Hungarian Reformed Church (Allen Park), The Rhapsody Hungarian Restaurant (Southgate), Hungarian Strudel Shop (Allen Park), the Hungarian Arts Club, Return to Old Delray/Old Detroit Facebook page and others.

Palacsinta - Hungarian crepes

1 cup flour	pinch of salt
2 large eggs	2/3 – 1 cup soda water
1/3 cup milk	1/3 cup butter, melted and cooled

This is our basic recipe. It all depends on the size of your eggs and you should plan to adjust the recipe because you need to get a very thin batter. We slowly add the wet ingredients with the dry and mix with a whisk. Some instructions recommend letting the batter rest for an hour before using, but we are often too hungry to wait that long.

1/4 cup of batter should be enough to cover the bottom of a 10 inch pan. These are very thin! If you don't have a crépe pan, you can use any kind of pan - even a cast iron skillet! It might take about 3-4 tries to get the hang of it. Be gentle with yourself until you get the hang of it. Even the mistakes are tasty so have fun with the process!

There are many variations for this recipe. Use the one that works for your life! Fill with jams, cocoa powder, or even with savory fillings. Once you get the hang of making them you will wonder why you took so long to give them a try!




